PRAYERS.

On motion of Mr. Lang (Saskatoon-Humboldt), seconded by Mr. Turner (Ottawa-Carleton), it was ordered,—That the Standing Committee on Agriculture be empowered to examine and enquire into the problem of distress or unreasonably low prices for non-quota feed grain being marketed in the designated area as defined by the Canadian Wheat Board Act and to report to the House observation and proposals thereon.

The Order being read for the third reading of Bill C-136, an Act respecting the expropriation of land;

Mr. Turner (Ottawa-Carleton), seconded by Mr. Greene, moved,—That the said bill be now read a third time and do pass.

After debate thereon, the question being put on the said motion, it was agreed to.

Accordingly, the said bill was read the third time and passed.

The House resumed debate on the motion of Mr. Chrétien, seconded by Mr. Côté (Longueuil),—That Bill C-152, An Act to amend the National Parks Act be now read a second time and referred to the Standing Committee on Indian Affairs and Northern Development.
