And also,—Report of the Director of Dominion Experimental Farms for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1930.

Mr. Bennet, seconded by Mr. Mackenzie King, moved,—That an humble Address be presented to His Majesty to express the deep concern of this House at the loss which His Majesty has sustained by the death of Her Royal Highness the Princess Royal; and to condole with His Majesty and to assure His Majesty that this House participates with the most affectionate and dutiful attachment in whatever concerns the feelings and interests of His Majesty.
