- X 2 *Obv.*—As last but with seventeen leaves on the helmet alligator coming out of the water in front of bust. A1. W14. F3.
- X 3 *Obv.*—As No. 1 but with seven fleur-de-lis on the helmet. W18. F4.
- X 4 *Obv.*—Inscription as in No. 1 Bust to right in civic dress. DU VIVIER. *Rev.*—Same as No. 2. F1.
