TO PORTLAND AND BOSTON—By steamers on every Monday and Thursday morning; also, every morning at 8.30 o'clock, and evening at 9 o'clock, by Railway, connecting at Fredericton Junction for Fredericton, and at McAdam Station for St. Stephen, St. Andrews, Bangor, &c.

TO YARMOUTH AND BOSTON—By steamer every Friday evening, at 6 o'clock.
