Toronto, July 19.
Dry Goods—Better demand for summer sorting suits, and fall goods are also selling freely. Values are firm.
Hardware—Fair movement in harvest specialties. General trade is about fair. Metals are in good demand and values firm.
Groceries—Fair movement. Valencia raisins are $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{1}{4}$ lower. Currants are easier, and lower grades of canned corn are $\frac{1}{4}$ lower.

Toronto Grain and Produce.

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The grain markets are steady. Wheat deliveries are light, and there is a fair demand from home millers. Manitoba grades are firm at same prices. Flour is very dull. The butter market is dull, and country holders are waiting for higher prices. Receipts of eggs are fair, and there is a good demand at 10c.

Wheat—Red and white winter wheat is worth 7c, middle 7 1/2 cts; spring, 1 1/2 cts to 2 cts; Manitoba wheat is worth 8 1/2 cts for No. 1, and 8 1/4 cts for No. 1 northern, and 8 1/2 cts for No. 2 northern, grinding in transit.

Oats—No. 2 white, 4 1/2 cts to 4 1/4 cts bushel, east.

Barley—No. 2 is quoted at 52c per bushel, east.
Flour—90 per cent. Ontario patents, \$2.85 to \$2.95 in buyers' bags, middle freights. Choice brands are held for 20c higher. Manitoba flour is firmer at \$4.00 to \$4.50 for Hungarian patents, and \$3.75 to \$4.00 for strong bakers', in carlots, bags included, on track, Toronto.

Millfeed—Shorts, \$20.50 to \$21 per ton, and bran, \$15.50 per ton, middle freights. Manitoba feed, 82c for bags of shorts and \$18 for bran, sacks included.

Oatmeal—\$4.70 for cars of bags, and \$4.50 in bulk for carlots, Toronto.

Hay—Carlots on track, \$9.50 to \$10 per ton for No. 1 Timothy.

Eggs—Case lots, new laid, 10c per dozen.

Butter—Pound rolls, 15 to 16c; large rolls, 15 to 16c; medium, 13 to 14c; creamery, 19c; choice, 19 to 20c; prints, 19c.

Cheese—10c to 10 1/2 cts for job lots.

Hides—7 1/2 cts for cow hides, 8 1/2 cts for steers, 8 1/2 cts for cow hides, 1c under these prices; calskins, 10c for No. 1 and 8c for No. 2; sheepskins, 6c to 7c; sheepskins, 90c to \$1 each; tallow, 6 1/2 to 6 1/4 cts.

Wool—Washed fleeces, 13c; unwashed, 7c.

Beans—\$1.30 per bushel for job lots of hand picked, and \$1.10 to \$1.20 for unpicked.

Dried Apples—3 to 3 1/2 cts for round lots, evaporated, 11c.

Maple Syrup—New is quoted here at \$1.00 per imperial gallon, in bulk or gallon tin.

Honey—10 to 10 1/2 cts per pound in bulk; in frames, 92 to 95c.

Poultry—Spring chickens, dressed, 60 to 10c per pair; turkeys, 10 to 12c for old.

Potatoes—50c per bushel for new in carlots.
