4. RECEPTION SERVICE.

The Reception Service took place on Friday evening, May 17th, the President in the chair.

Arthur Noble Miller, who was the only candidate, related his Christian experience and call to the work of the ministry. His reception into the ministry was moved by Rev. C. Ladner, seconded by Rev.
