Extract of the Declaration of Mr. Kirkland, late Surgeon of the 51st Regiment.

TPON my Arrival at Albany from Ofwego on the 11th of July I gave "General Abercrombie a particular Account " of the State of that Place, and the Danger " it was in of an Attack from the French, " having, before I left Ofwego, received In-" telligence that the French were collecting "their Troops towards that Place; which "Information was likewise afterwards con-"firmed by some French Prisoners, we had " taken in the Action with the French upon " the River Onondago: I also delivered Ge-" neral Abercrombie at the same time, several " public Letters and Accounts, which were " fent by me from Ofwego; upon which the " 44th Regiment was ordered to hold itself in Readiness (with the Battoe-men under " Captain Bradstreet) to march for Oswego at " an Hour's Warning."
