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cession for the Tempted and Tried, for those who are Prospering, and those who are in Trouble. We acknowledge our sins, and ask for pardon. We pray for new hearts, for the gift of the Spirit, for peace here and happiness hereafter.

In short, if we have only hearts to pray, here are Prayers just suited to our need; so devout, so spiritual, and so scriptural, that many who do not worship with us have acknowledged that no Prayers can equal ours.

But while our Church provides us with this beautiful Form of Prayer for Public Worship, she does not require us to use it on all other occasions. In our private Devotions, or in our Social Gatherings, she leaves it to our own discretion to use any Prayers which may best suit us.

5. I will state one more reason, before I close this chapter—Our Church gives special honour to the Bible; and on that account we may well love her.
