appertain to the point in queftion : If the Committee felt difpoled to fay any thing thereon for the purpole of giving the Governor real information, any one of the Members might, in a very few minutes, have fatiffied himfelf fo far, as to be fufficiently convinced that those Statements were entirely erroneous.

The Committee complain that no Governor of this Province had heretofore paid fo little regard to the advice of the Council, as was paid to the Report of the Committee of the 20th of June laft: This the Governor conceives may be very true; But the Governor believes it to be equally true, that no Council ever before built their advice upon fo great an Ertor, in regard to actual Facts: Thefe circumftancestherefore balance one another.

Any difefteem which the Committee may labour under on that account, is yet retrievable; and the Governor would willingly hope that it might be retrieved: It would be retrieved at once, by acknowledging (what every body knows to be the troth) that the Report of the 20th of June laft was founded on a mittake; and by giving a chearful affiftance in carrying His Majefly's gracious Regulations into execution.
