coming forward to regret my departure, several such be'r in a flood of tears. My heart and my eyes fill while write. How painful the thought that no provision is ride for the increasing wants of such a Mission ! May God for His dear Son's sake, carry on the work in that bay which His unworthy servant has begun ! May not one of my dear people perish for want of the means of grace and sa' vation ; May godly and self-denying missionaries be set among them, and may they find more pleasure in leading sculs to Christ than in looking after worldly ease and cerfort. And, oh ! may many a heart among the wealthy : d affluent in this land of plenty, in this beautiful climat ; stirred up to make the hie of the missionary as comfor ' h'e as possible, that he may have as many inducements a can be to remain in such a place. This is a work of faith. -In faith, then, let us work, and let us rest satisfied that " ur labeur shall not be in vain in the Lord."
