

LaRose and McKinley Higher-Cobalt Lake and Peterson Off

IRREGULAR ACTION IN THE GRAIN MARKET

Chicago Fit Fails To Hold Recent Improvement—Intermittent Rallies Give Way To Declines—Corn and Oats Easier.

CHICAGO, Nov. 7.—Belief that a big stock of spring wheat would be on hand here before the close of navigation had a bearing effect on today's market. Latest prices were down 1-2c market. Corn showed a decline of 1-2c to 7-8c from last night and oats a loss of 1-16c to 1-4c. In provisions there was an advance of 5c to 10c.

Wheat prices at this time were more than a fraction above last night. Outside of covering by shorts, the only substantial support came from the leading long interest and was not aggressive. On the other hand, some of the big cash concerns sold December wheat, and were declared to be anticipating heavy arrivals by way of the lake. Assertions that after Jan. 1 receipts at primary terminals would be light helped to bring about the one important rally about midday. Its influence had completely worn out before the last bell.

Corn and Oats Easier.
Corn turned weak owing to fine weather. Cash grades were firm on account of small offerings from the new crop. Arrivals of oats gave no sign of a let up. In consequence the market inclined downward. Scantiness of the hog supply took provisions higher, but speculative selling led to some reaction.

LIVERPOOL GRAIN EXCHANGE.
LIVERPOOL, Nov. 7.—The market opened steady, 1/4d to 1/2d higher, being influenced by the strength in America and part of the advance was lost with heavy Russian arrivals from Argentina and lower with private advices reporting pressure in continental markets and a return of favorable weather. A few arrivals with a promise of lighter house buying here. Russian offerings are heavy with holders firm.

Corn advanced 1/4d, and later further advanced 1/4d to 1/2d, with the under-ones firm. The steeper closing in Buenos Ayres wheat caused shorts to cover.

MARKET SHOWS HIGH DEGREE OF ACTIVITY

Cobalt Stocks Are Very Irregular—Porcupines Quiet and a Shade Easier—Considerable Investment Buying Under Way—Hollinger at \$15.00.

The mining markets have shown a high degree of activity lately and are only to be accepted as an indication of the greater respect which the public is according these issues. During the last few days there has been a strong demand for outside account in evidence at recurring intervals, and this had a marked effect on prices.

The market yesterday showed a good deal of irregularity, but in the main gave a good account of itself. The Cobalts were particularly strong, with the big dividend payers the most conspicuous features. Excellent buying of these stocks has been noted of late, and doubt founded on the high dividend returns indicated in the present price.

The improvement was by no means limited to these, however, as some of the cheaper issues were also prominent. Dividend Payers Strong.

It was in La Rose and McKinley-Derragh that the greatest bull action of the day was shown. The former is a full ten points to 14.45, and closed with no stock offering under \$2.60. McKinley crossed the two dollar mark for the first time since August, with an active buying demand in evidence. There has been considerable buying of an investment nature under way in these stocks of late, and as the market has been pretty well cleaned up, prices are easily raised.

The cheaper list, higher values were reached by Bailey, which sold up to 7 1/4. Gifford, which touched 6 1/4, and Beaver, were weakly, but pretty well offset the improvement elsewhere. Cobalt Lake dropped back to 4 1/4, a net loss of four points, but was higher at the close when traders were bidding 4 1/2. Peterson was off a full point to 14.8 under profit-taking sales. City of Cobalt was firm at 24, despite the statement of the directors that the present advance had not been warranted. Island Smelter Up.

The Porcupines were generally slightly easier, the at no time were Hollinger sold between \$14.95 and \$15, and at the close stood with none of the change. This being practically unchanged for the day, but was stronger, with an advance to 16 1/2, but the other stocks did not do much. Domes sold at \$15.75, a decline from the last previous close to \$16.45.

In the miscellaneous department the continued strength of Island Smelters was the feature. The shares crossed three cents for the first time in many weeks. No explanation was forthcoming for the movement.

EUROPEAN CROPS ARE IN FAIR CONDITION
Sowing Held Up in Great Britain—India Is in Need of Rain.

Broomhall's weekly summary of foreign crop conditions, issued yesterday, in Liverpool, follows:
United Kingdom.—There have been general rains during the past week, which have hindered the sowing of the new crop, but to no serious extent.

France.—Outlook generally favorable. Supplies from interior light, but expected to be larger in near future. Germany.—Crop conditions very favorable, but offerings of native wheat increasing. May, the market for native wheat increasing. Russia.—Our agent reports that it is thought that the recent frost did no damage. Supplies of wheat are fair. The yield of corn is large, but the quality poor. The weather is mild.

Roumania.—The sowing of wheat crop is progressing satisfactorily. The corn outlook has improved, but it is not likely that there will be any export this year.

Italy.—Condition of the new seedlings favorable. Native wheat remains very dear. Spain.—New-sown wheat crop is in need of rain. North Africa.—Crop outlook favorable. South Africa.—Severe drought continues, and crop outlook is bad.

India.—Crops in some districts are in need of rain, but the outlook is not serious. The weather is mild.
