

GOLD \$12,400 TO THE TON.

St. Paul, Minn., Jan. 27.—Assays completed by a St. Paul firm on sand taken from borings at Sibley, S.D., show results of 640 ounces of gold, or a gold value of \$12,400 a ton.

The gold-bearing sand was struck at a depth of 105 feet, and continued for a depth of four feet, underlying a stratum of white pebbles. Free gold was apparent in much of the sand taken out, and after local tests were made average samples were made up and sent to St. Paul.
