MUST ISSUE PERMIT

But City Has Right to Impose Re strictions in Use of Building.

The action brought by Mary and Henry Lane against Robert McCallum, city architect, to compel the latter to issue a building permit for a rooming house on Iroquois-avenue, Centre Island, was heard by Justice

Riddell yesterday.

Counsel for the Lanes pointed out that there were many rooming houses on the island and also that since the on the island and also that since the first application for a rooming house had been made, permission had been granted for the right to make additions to a residence, but, so far, neither a reply nor a permit had been received. After counsel for the city had objected that the first two applications were nullified on technical points, Judge Riddell found that the city had a right to impose any restrictions it wished to impose any restrictions it wished regarding the nature and use of the buildings to be erected. But he also found that the plaintiff was entitled to put up her house, tho she was not entitled to set up this judgment as an excuse should she be sued for using it as a rooming house.

Mr. Lennox produced plans to show that this could be safely and inexpensively done, and that ample room would then be available. Commissioner Harris objected, but did not explain his objection. The matter will be passed on to council.
