The reduction of 15 cents means a saving of \$50,000 per year to gas consumers and perhaps another \$50,000 would be chopped off if the appeal succeeds, but, in spite of the fact that the Gas Company could only tax about \$1250 for costs should the appeal succeed, some of the aldermen are trying to kill this appeal. At the last meeting of the Council the chief opponents of the proposition were Ald. Saunders, Gowanlock, Hubbard and Burns. The proceedings on Tuesday will be given very fully in The World and every gas consumer should keep his eyes on the position taken by the aldermen on this important question.

The excitement continually increased, especially in the streets. An effigy of a lady in bloomers on a bicycle was suspended opposite the Senate House and there was a large banner over the Caius College gateway, inscribed: "Get You to Girton. Get you to Newnham. Here is no Place for Maids."

Towards the close of the voting thousands of people congregated outside tac Senate House and the undergraduates started letting off fireworks, during which two crackers exploded in the midst of the Senate House.
