

ALIANS KEEP ON WITH OFFENSIVE

Each Austrian Fortified Line in Trentino and Attack It.

ANOLLI ALSO FALLS

Commit of Monte Maio Yields Before Dashing Attacks.

On the Trentino Front, the Austrians have begun an attack on the Italian fortified positions between the Tottio and Foppiano; they have driven the Austrians from sections of trenches north of Pedescaia; have carried trenches between the Sella and Montefalco on the Isonzo.

On Saturday they reported occupying Zanoli in the Arva valley, and have obtained contact with the army on the Sette Comuni plateau. They have also reached the top of the Monte Maio, and are clearing the Austrians from the remainder of the ground on the summit. Severe fighting at close quarters with grenades proceeding in the confined space of this zone. Progress has also been made by Italian infantry in the area of the Sella and Montefalco valleys. Stubborn resistance is still being offered by the enemy on the Pasubio in his fortified positions between the Spil and Comagnon.

Our advance continued along the Poisina line in spite of the heavy fire of a large number of hostile batteries in commanding positions at Monte Pass and on Monte Maggio. On the left, our troops overcame the resistance of the enemy, and reached the top of the rocky ground of which they are now driving out the remainder of the enemy.

Our heavy guns yesterday renewed bombardment of Toblach, Innichen Silliam in the Pasturia Valley. Our infantry is reported to have made progress in the Sella and Montebach valleys. Our artillery shelled my defenses on the Sella of Ciflida, and reached the top of Monte Sella. Our artillery was active along the line of Borgo Carinzia, Gorizia.
