SWEDEN IS FULL OF PEACE RUMORS

Pro-German Newspapers Now

Pro-German Newspapers Now
Join in Propaganda to
End War.

Stockholm, April 19, via London,
April 20.—M. Stauming, minister withing out portfolio in the Danish cabinet, has arrived here for a conference with the local Socialists over the approaching meeting of the Socialist international committee to be held in Stockholm. The peace propaganda is being actively carried on, but it appears to be almost entirely supported by the activist and other pro-German papers and elements, with the exception of a few of the most radical ultra-Socialists, whose activities are inspired not by partisanship for one or the other groups of beliligerent nations, but by "general brotherhood of man" ideas.

The newspapers which formerly headed the activist movement for Sweden's entrance into the war on Germany's side are now eagerly grasping at every peace rumor and publishing in particular much concerning the separate movement in Russia. Much money also is being paid from some source for pro-peace circulars, which are being widely distributed by mall over Sweden.

One of these circulars, captioned (Shall the War Be Prolonged to Starvation, or Shall We Have Peace Quickly?" attacks the parties of the vation, or Shall We Have Peace Quickly?" attacks the parties of the

left, especially the Socialists, as the most bitter enemies of pelice, and declares that they desire "war to the uttermost against hated Germany." LOAN OF TEN MILLIONS TO AID SHIPBUILDING

Ottawa, April 20.—A loan of ten million dollars offered by the government to the imperial munitions board to aid in the development of wooden shipbuilding in Canada has been accepted by the board.

Specifications and designs of the type of wooden vessels required have been under discussion between the board, the representatives of the

board, the representatives of the British minister of shipping and various shipbuilding firms. It is hoped to begin work very shortly and that the building of a considerable number will be arranged for in Canada, probably for the most part on the Pacific, where suitable lumber is available in abundance.

CANADIAN WOUNDED

Warning Given as Steamer Neared U. S. Coast Caused

New York, April 20.—Passengers on a steamship which arrived here tonight, declared they had not slept for two days because of a submarine warning given them by a United States warship as they approached the American coast. According to the story, the warship steamed alongside the steamer and the captain megaphoned the information that there was a report that two enemy submarines were lurking between the steamship and its destination.

The captain of the merchant vessel then gave directions that a zigzag course be followed, it was said, and the passengers were directed to be ready for sudden call to the lifeboats.
