Special.)-A large party of Doukhowomen and children, arlved here to-day after three days on rived here to-day after three days on trail. The police arrested three of the ringleaders, and will try to persuade the remainder to go back. The party are, as usual, looking for the Messiah, and want universal peace proclaimed as a presage to the millennium. They are, however, warmly clothed, and wear shoes. The present warm weather encourages them on their pilgrimage, and they regard this as a direct intervention of divine power in their behalf. English-speaking settlers are indignant at the Doukhobors' antics, and are said to be preparing a memorial to the Dominion government for cancellation of the latter's land grant, as constituting a serious detriment to the settlement of the districts. John E. Redmond demonstrated last night what many people have been wondering at in Toronto—why he was leader of the Irish party. He attributed his position to Edward Blake, whose name received an ovation whenever it was mentioned, and whose choice of Redmond is a tribute to his own penetration. The Irish leader is the man for the work. Eloquence goes without saying. But he was acute, he was diplomatic, and he never missed his aim. Loyal Canadians sat thru the meeting and went home probably without realizing that Ontario's premier had spoken at a meeting where the National Anthem, nor the "Maple Leaf." for the matter of that, found no place. Mr. Redmond described the three steps to home rule already taken as the banishment of famine, the abolition of coercion, and the ousting of landlordism. He added in his banquet speech that his party could not rest till Irish public opinion was as potent in Ireland as public opinion was in Ontario, Irishmen had been shown in the county councils to be capable of governing themselves, and the Irish landlords were now actually engaged in evolving a home rule scheme of their own. Ireland's opportunity had come, and he confidently predicted the speedy triumph of the home rule cause.
