FAILS TO STOP JAZZ, IS ARRESTED LATER

Atlantic City Cafe Owner Cannot Enjoin Rival—Is Accused by Cabaret Singer.

Atlantic City, N. J., July 11.—The application for an injunction to restrain the jazz music in the Music Box Cafe here was refused by Vice-Chancellor Robert H. Ingersoll.

The right of injunction, Chancellor Ingersoll held, stands or falls on the question of whether the cafe music was a nuisance. He held that the affidavits of Ralph Welford and David Abrams in answer to the petition of Nathan Goldenberg were sufficiently strong to create a doubt in his mind as to the existence of a nuisance. He further held that the court had no power to enforce a city ordinance.

Goldenberg had brought action to shut up the music in the early morning hours at the cafe on the ground that it disturbed the neighbors. Goldenberg himself was arrested in the "cave war" on the complaint of Hazel Romaine, a cabaret singer, who charged that shortly after midnight recently a score of tin cans were thrown through the window of the restaurant while she was dancing. They came from the direction of Goldenberg's cafe next door. They were followed by a shower of milk bottles, Miss Romaine said. Goldenberg denied the charge, but will be arraigned.

MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

The barn was totally destroyed and two automobiles housed in the structure, an Oldsmobile and a Chevrolet, were rendered useless. The barn was valued at \$1,000 and is partially covered by insurance. Both cars were insured.

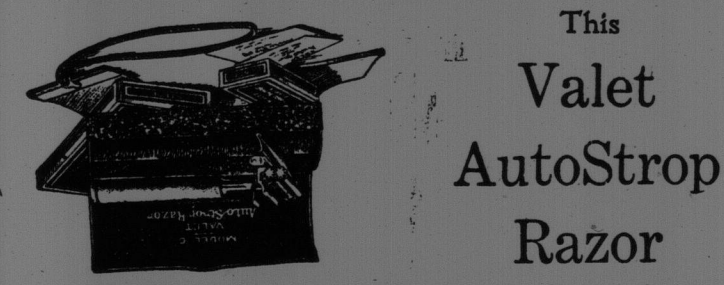

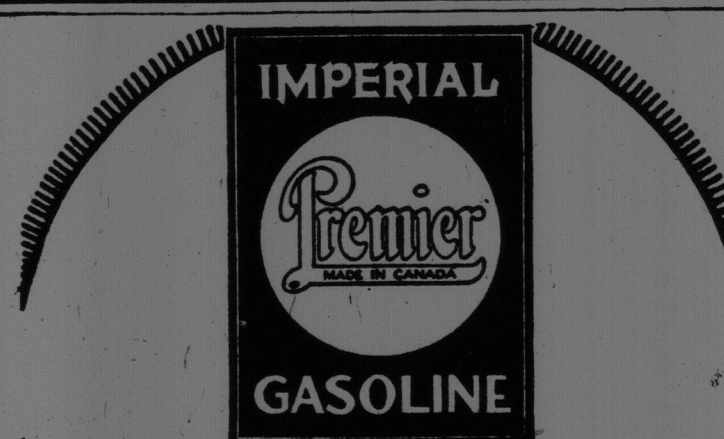

SAYS CITY SHOULD BE THE CENSOR OF DANCES

Dallas, Texas, July 11.—Every city should have a dance censorship board of its own. Dancing should be controlled by the individual cities rather than by the states.

This is the opinion of Mrs. John Priestly Hart, dancing instructor, in discussing the Duke dance bill, which will come up before the New York legislature for consideration next year. This bill aims at the state regulation of dancing.

"Strict censorship is undoubtedly necessary, but in my opinion, the control should be exerted by the municipality," Mrs. Hart said.

"A board should be created, consisting of the mayor, the moving picture censor, the dance hall censor, the president of the women's clubs, heads of the par-
