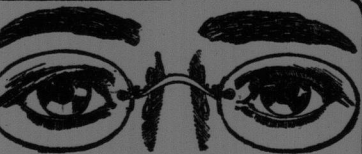

WHOLESALE PRICES DROP.

Dun's Index Falls 4.1 Per Cent in March. Dun's weighted index of commodity prices at wholesale in the United States for April 1 fell to 874.494 as compared with 918.191 for March 1, and the record high of \$263.832, reached last May 1.

Prices, according to Dun, thus recorded more sharply during March than during February, or 4.1 per cent, as compared with a drop of 2.1 per cent, a month ago. These two declines compare with declines of 6.4 per cent, in January, 6.2 in December, and 6.8 in November. The index, as a whole, now stands 45 per cent higher than its level during 1913.

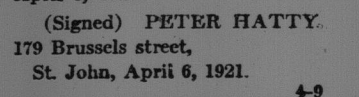
March's decline was fairly widespread, but the drop in breadstuffs prices was especially marked. A loss was recorded for every group excepting other food.

BRITISH EMPIRE STEEL MERGER IS RATIFIED

(Canadian Press Despatch.)
Halifax, April 7.—The British Empire Steel Corporation, merger was formally ratified today at meetings of the shareholders of the Dominion Steel Corporation and Nova Scotia Steel and Coal Company, two of the companies involved, held at Trenton and Sydney, respectively, according to word reaching Halifax tonight.

The Maritime Nail Works and James Pender & Co., Ltd., both of St. John, are included in the merger. Stanley E. Elkin, M.P., attended the Sydney meeting.

Today's meetings virtually completed the consolidation of these companies and Halifax Shipyards, Limited, the only remaining item of procedure of immediate interest to the shareholders is the actual exchange of the existing certificates for shares in the new corporation.

Arrangements are so far advanced that it is expected that the actual exchange may be made on April 15. The shares of the British Empire Steel Corporation will be listed on the stock exchange in Montreal, Toronto and New York, and probably in London also.

STATE OF TRADE IN UNITED STATES

(Bradstreet's.)
On the whole, distributive trade seems to have fairly held its own, as have manufacture and industry, gains in some lines of the latter offsetting losses elsewhere, whereas collections have again sagged after two weeks of improvement.

The irregularity hitherto noted in reports from different branches of trade and areas of country is still manifest to perhaps, a more extreme degree, and general characterization is just as difficult as ever, except that it may be said that immediate need buying characteristics trade in spring goods, while fall buying, except in instances noted in recent weeks, is done with caution approaching timidity.

Still there is evidence that, while improvement, of which there are many instances, is slow, some really formative forces are at work giving promise of better things to come when much needed readjustments now under discussion are completed. Chief among the latter might be mentioned most prominently the effort to clear up the railway transportation situation, which is exceedingly in such critical condition as to have received almost universal government attention this week. In this particular case the need of reducing freight rates, which added to other costs are claimed to be weighing down business, is being increasingly stressed as an additional reason for lower scales of labor costs, and it is reported that the next message from the president will hold this sharply up to the view of the people of the country.

In the building trades, too, the chief obstacle to activity is said to be the matter of wages. Little cars last week show the greatest total ever known. Another direction in which constructive work is being attempted is in the matter of aiding export trade, especially in farm products, with the view of improving the position of the cotton and grain growers.
