NEW CUBAN CONSUL NOW IN THE CITY

Armando Lopez, who has been serving as Cuban consul at this port since the resignation of Don Jose Orlando Ferrer, and who was the first consul since the outbreak of the great war to put the St. John consulate on a self-sustaining basis, left last night, accompanied by Senora Lopez, for New York city to resume his position with the Cuban vice-consulate there.






