Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

ANY Person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of arable Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion land office. Price \$500 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$500 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

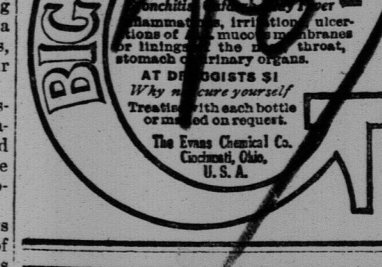
