Harvey, who in the past had taken a deep interest in the work of the School, were called away to their rest, leaving in every instance young families to mourn their loss.

The effect of this trouble was very marked in the attendance of the Scholars for the months of September and October, and it is only as the year closes, that we may be said to be really carrying on the work of the school with any degree of comfort.
