Q.49	How long were you teaching altogether during the two years or more that you were absent?

Q.60	You said that you got very little consideration from the Wedical Officers?
A.50	Yes sir.
Q.51	Were you ever treated by a civilian doctor for this trouble?
A.51	No I have never actually received treatment.
