- Q.41 Did you apply to your Commanding Officer to be transferred so you could do this work?
- A.41 No sir.
- Q.42 When did you first decide to go in for this teaching?
- A.42 Well, even years ago I have thought about it.
- Q.43 I mean since you joined the army?
- A.43 After I went A.W.L. sir.
- Q.44 What salary were you getting?
- A.44 Forty-five dollars a week sir.
- Q.45 Yes?
- A.45 I started at forty-five dollars a week and when I left I was making fifty a week.
- Q.46 You were receiving fifty dollars a week?
- A.46 Yes sir.
- Q.47 Did you ever think of coming back to the army?
- A.47 Well the course was supposed to be over in either June or July.
- Q.48 And you took from that, that you would go back then?
- A.48 Yes sir.
- Q.49 How long were you teaching altogether during the two years or more that you were absent?
- A.49 Ten months.
- Q.50 You said that you got very little consideration from the Medical Officers?
- A.50 Yes sir.
- Q.51 Were you ever treated by a civilian doctor for this trouble?
- A.51 No I have never actually received treatment.
- Q.52 Did you do anything about your condition in civilian life as regards seeing a doctor?
- A.52 No sir.
