This pernicious delusion is fast vanishing, and perhaps at no former period in our history did the aristocracy possess the confidence and respect of the industrial classes in such ample measure as they now do. We must not lose sight of the intercourse, to which the London delegates refer, will be drawn still closer, and that the example they set of making a friendly advance to the nobility of the land will spread to other parts of the country, for we feel assured that in every instance the alliance would prove beneficial to the community.
