

HER MISSION HAS BEEN FULFILLED

The Spirit of Joan of Arc Today Unites the People of Britain and France.

Paris, May 21.—In an article which Le Martin published recently, former President Poincaré, writing of the centenary of Joan of Arc, says that the spirit of the "Maiden of Orleans" links France and England today in a unity upon which depends the future peace of the world.

"It is today," he says, "that Joan of Arc fulfills the last part of her mission in bringing together forever in the sacredness of her memory, the heroes of those who sought to push out of her kingdom and the descendants of the chevaliers who fought beneath her banner."

From the flames which burned Joan of Arc came the spirit of light and truth which has finally associated, in common accomplishment after long centuries of misunderstanding, the peoples of France and England. Joan gave to the wavering and uncertain people a dynasty around which was formed our national unity.

"She made possible the France of Francis the First, of Henry the Fourth, of Louis the Fourteenth, of the revolution and of today. If at the same time she helped, as England from the Continent, she simply continued our neighbors across the Channel to their national destiny and in reconciling them, in spite of themselves, to their insular traditions, she prepared them to assume the mastery of the seas. For long centuries the two peoples, seated on opposite sides of the Channel, regarded each other

with persistent hostility which broke out, too often, in war. Then the day came when, united upon the field of battle, they realized the power of their permanent union. Grown to full stature in the exercise of their liberty, they have come to understand what together they can do for the liberty of the world and have joined hands for that work.

Common Ideals.

"From 1562 to 1605, the Entente Cordiale established itself and grew. The old causes of misunderstanding came by one disappeared. Accords were signed with reward to Newfoundland, Egypt, Morocco and equatorial Africa. Fulfilled, the Ministers of Edward the Seventh followed a new policy towards France and they found at Dijon, as well as at Orléans, dispositions favorable to collaboration. The two chancellors adopted the habit of consulting one another in all grave circumstances. In the years which preceded the war this association, while it did not lead to a definite alliance, enabled England and France, at least for a while, to soften the menaces which threatened Europe. Now that the two nations have fought side by side for a common ideal, how can they, on the morrow of victory, not be given to the growing of a common bond of friendship and a common ideal of peace?"

In the Maritime Provinces and in Western Canada a good deal of attention will, under any circumstances, be given to the growing of soiling crops and crops for ensilage. It is estimated that the Province of New Brunswick will have double the number of silos than in the province at present.

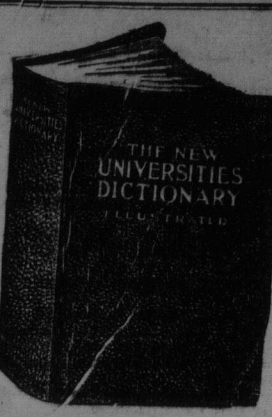
