Full Returns from the Newfoundland

Sustained by Five Majorities.

St. John's, Nfld., Nov. 14.

Full returns are now in and the Gov-

ernment is sustained by as large a ma-

jority as its most sanguine supporters

expected. Bennett's party, after the

most desperate efforts, succeeded in car-

rying four constituencies, electing thir-

teen members of Assembly, but were de-

feated by overwhelming majorities in

the other ten. Bennett was returned for

Piaget, where there was no opposition

to him, but was defeated at Burin. The

House stands eighteen Government to

thirteen opposition.

Hal, Dominion Emigration Agent at

Liverpool, has written to the Marine and

British North American built ships in

consequence of the high price of iron
