TO BE MOUNTIES**

Former Dieppe Police Officers are very proud to have become members of the RCMP. Following several police studies in the Province of New Brunswick, The Honourable Jane Barry, Solicitor General, announced on April 17, 1997, that the RCMP had been chosen as the police force to police Moncton, Dieppe and Riverview. Following a long dispute between the City of Moncton and the Province, Dieppe facing reality right from when the very first shot was fired, had a decision that both Chief Rouse as well as Mayor Malenfant made without hesitation for the benefit of not only its members but the citizens of our municipality.

During an emergency meeting called on Saturday morning, April 19, 1997, at Dieppe Town Hall, with every member of the Force, as well as Mayor and Council in attendance, a resolution was passed to support the RCMP as the only choice acceptable for a regional police force, "Language and Service being the key factors in the takeover." The following Monday night, at a regular Council meeting, the resolution was ratified at a legal session and made public.

Today, we give thanks to D/Commr. Roy Berlinquette, C/Supt. Garry Loepky, as well as front-line warriors C/Supt. William Lenton, Supt. Bruce Rogerson and Insp.
