PARIS, April 11.—(By William Phillip Simms)—Confirmation of a policy of the protestrait revolution, has been received in government circles here, it was announced today.

According to available information the Bolsheviki scheme is this: Spartacans will the possible acquiescence of the present government, will assume administrative power in Germany during or immediately after the Versailles congress.

Once in control the Spartacans will greet allied demands with folded arms and a general attitude of: "Do what you like but as far as we are concerned we will do nothing." Meaning they will refuse to pay indemnities or carry out any of the other peace terms.

The Spartacans thus hope to force Allies to occupy Central Europe, which they believe would embitter the allied peoples against their governments.
