It is proposed that the Total Receipts of the Colonial Secretary should be reduced eventually to £. 800; but on the principle explained in the Despatches respecting Mauritius, which were sent to the Treasury 27th July 1831, only half the reduction has been made in the case of the present holder of the office. His receipts, therefore, since April 1833, have been reduced from £. 1,417 their original amount, to £. 1,046 or thereabouts.

Note.—No Increase or Decrease in Amount applied for to Parliament. In the Emoluments received in the Colony by the several Officers there is a Decrease of £. 279, occasioned by variations in the amount of their Fees. R. W. H.
