

Children's concert

The Mississauga Symphony Orchestra, with Dr. Boyd Neel conducting, performed its kickoff children's concert to a full house Saturday afternoon at Glenforest secondary school.

The children listened to a program of ballet music by Delibes, a Mozart horn concerto with soloist David Lambert, a modern piece by composer John Weinzwieg of the University of Toronto and a Mendelssohn overture.

The highlight of the concert was a performance by 10-year-old guest artist Ofra Harnoy, who plays the cello with outstanding maturity and technique. Miss Harnoy, who performed the Stamitz Concerto for Violin, began playing the cello at age six in 1971 and now studies with David Hetherington of the Toronto Symphony Orchestra.

The orchestra displayed an improved sound in depth and sonority and under Boyd Neel's direction is achieving significant progress as an ensemble.

The first adult concert of the season will be held Nov. 29 at 8:30 p.m. at Cawthra Park Secondary School. Soloists will be David Lambert and Ofra Harnoy. For tickets, contact Carole Burgess at 278-6475.

Bean won't seek recount

Frank Bean, the ratepayer who lost by 44 votes last week to Chic Murray in the ward 3 by-election, will not ask for a recount.

In a statement released at a city council meeting Monday night, Bean said that after careful consideration with his workers, "we realize that we would require a change of more than one per cent of the vote to affect the result and this is unlikely."

"Rather than cloud the issue," the insurance company official said he would not seek a recount. Murray, a former Mississauga mayor, won the election on the last poll — Applewood Place — where he lives.

Bean said he was officially declaring his candidacy for next fall's election and promised to be a regular council observer in the next year.

"We think it is important that council be allowed to get on with the job, and we trust that the new councillor-elect and the council will work together for the benefit of the people of ward 3 and Mississauga," said Bean.

Murray sat at his first council meeting Monday.

Man gets 18 months

A former Mississauga man has been sentenced to 18 months in reformatory for criminal negligence and buggery in the shooting death of an 11-year-old boy.

Robert Bruce Leybourne, 33, formerly of Ellengale Dr., moved to Peterborough after the charges were laid as a result of pressure from neighbors.

He was arrested after police investigated the death of the boy on Feb. 18, 1974. He was also charged with two counts of gross indecency, indecent assault on a male and dangerous use of a firearm.

Police learned Leybourne had befriended several boys, aged 9 to 14, from poor homes in the west end of Toronto. He took them out to dinner at restaurants, bought them gifts and took them out to his home, where the boys could play with weights and a pool table in his recreation room. Eventually he enticed the boys into performing sex acts with him.

Court was told the 11-year-old and another boy, aged 9, asked to see a rifle which Leybourne kept in a bedroom closet. As Leybourne took the rifle from the shelf, it went off and struck the 11-year-old in the chest. He died a half-hour later in Mississauga hospital.

Statements were obtained from six boys concerning sexual acts from Leybourne. He was free on bail until his sentencing last week.

Judge Alan Hollingsworth sentenced him to 12 months for criminal negligence causing death, and an additional six months for buggery, to be followed by a term of one year probation. Defence lawyer Sydney Conn had asked for

probation while assistant crown attorney Chip O'Connor argued for a reformatory sentence of two years less a day.

Judge Hollingsworth said the crimes were serious, but he didn't want to send Leybourne to penitentiary.
