Walk through the front door of this old wood cabin and you are back in the early 1800's. It's like the book Time and Time Again. A gracious lady greets you in the dress of that era and sitting in the dining room is a young woman hooking a rug. She, too, is in an old fashioned costume.

This is the Bradley Museum of Clarkson, built about 1880, situated at the corner of Meadowwood and Orr Roads, beside beautiful Meadowwood Park.

How about a family picnic using the benches and tables in the park and then a tour of the museum? It is open Friday and Sunday from 1 to 5 p.m. and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Every room in the Bradley home is full of interesting articles and furniture of the 1800's. The living room is elegant and formal with a focal fireplace, horsehair sofa and shelves of books. On two forms are two wedding dresses, neither of which is white. The dining room is more of a dining-family room with a lovely sideboard and dishes. Sitting in a rocking chair was Agnes Mitchell, the rug hooker, who said that there would be demonstrations of rug hooking the first and last Sundays of every month.

The kitchen is a pure delight and full of interesting things. Just to mention a few, there are a dry sink, a Brockville wood burning pot-bellied stove of 1870 vintage and a small circular bathtub which, Muriel Hare, tour guide, said children liked the best. There are herbs hanging from the ceiling to dry, an old-fashioned butter churner and in the spring

and fall, old fashioned cooking is demonstrated. The main floor bedroom has a cradle, a bed with rope springs, a straw mattress and a pottery bed warmer. There are lovely old baby dresses and nighties complete with night caps.

Upstairs now — there is a spinning wheel and loom. The Oakville Weavers and Spinners Association give demonstrations the second Sunday of every month. Beautiful old quilts and rugs are on display as well as old-fashioned wallpaper on the walls. There is also a sewing machine and wool winder and pictures of all the Fathers of Confederation.

There are so many beautiful things to see that you will just have to go and have a guided tour and hear the history of the Lewis Bradley Pioneer Museum from one of the Township of Toronto Historical Foundation Incorporated members, who look after the Bradley House very well.

At the final meeting before the summer recess, the Clarkson Park Royal Senior Friendship Club was entertained by the Park Royal Community Association with

a wine and cheese party. Mary Houghton, president, and her fellow members graciously thanked the association.

Another "treat" was the mystery bus trip which took members to Peterborough for a tour of the lift locks and a shopping spree. They stopped at the Flying Dutchman restaurant at Bowmanville for lunch on the way there and dinner on the return trip. This concludes a very successful year for the club with meetings resuming in September.
