Dear Colonel Henderson:

Mr. John D. Rockefeller, Jr., of New York, is to be in Ottawa to address the Canadian Club at luncheon on Saturday, April 13th. As his purpose in coming to Canada to address the Canadian Clubs of Montreal in Ottawa, is one of helping to further good-will between the United States and ourselves, I have wondered whether, while Mr. Rockefeller is in the city, it would be possible for him to meet His Excellency, and if, as he is to be my guest while here, I might have the privilege of bringing him to call at a convenient hour.

Mr. Rockefeller arrives here from Montreal on the evening of Friday the 12th of April, and hopes to remain over with me until the afternoon of Sunday, the 14th. The Club luncheon, as you know, is in the middle of the day on Saturday. Should His Excellency be at the luncheon, that would, of course, more than serve the purpose I have in view.
