Allied heavy bombers have resumed their night attacks.
Air heavies of the R.A.F. roared across the English
east coast during the night to hammer targets in western
and northwestern Germany. Synthetic oil plants
in Hamberg were heavily bombed.

New gains have been scored by the eighth Army in Italy.
British and Empire forces thrusting ahead through German defenses in the PO Valley have established a small bridgehead across a canal running north from the captured town of FORLI. Other eighth Army units have moved into the town of GAMBELLARA six miles southwest of RAVENNA. In the Fifth Army sector, troops of an Indian Division have captured the important hill position of MONTE POMPEGNO southwest of MODIGLIANA.

GERMANY

WESTERN FRONT
U.S. troops are getting closer to the SWAR basin.
METZ is now threatened with encirlement from the southeast. Road and rail communications with the city have been cut or are under artillery fire.

EASTERN FRONT
Russian troops are bearing down on BUDAPEST from two sides.
Soviet forces are now firmly astride the railway connecting
BUDAPEST with MISKOLC and are closing on the latter town.

Carrier planes of the United States Third Fleet have destroyed an enemy convoy of four transports and six destroyers. In ORMOC BAY, LEYTE. American ground forces on LEYTE have made new gains across the rugged terrain south of CARIGARA BAY. The TOKYO radio says that U.S. warships have bombarded TWO Island in the VOLCANO Group.

The premier of the Puppet Chinese Government at NANKING has died.
