2. Exactly what was the type of secret and confidential information. Will the foreign mission be identified.

3. Will any persons be charged. If so , on what grounds? If not, then to what purpose is the investigation directed.

4. Are persons being detained nations of a foreign country, or are they all Canadians. Could those being detained be grouped by suspects, witness or other category. How many tox date in each group?
