While they had a grasp of the broad principles for which they strove, they were not visionaries, but eminently practical men -

> Interested in the day-to-day problems of the people and sought to remove the injustices and the difficulties in their daily lives to which the existing system gave rise;

For the most part, they were educated and intelligent individuals, many of them well-to-do, who commanded the respect of their fellow citizens -
