Statement for Accused. - Second charge.

- (1) Cpl. Moody thought he saw Tpr. Smith.
- (2) He stated to the C.O. in his orderly room that he had seen Tpr. Smith in the house.
- (3) Cpl. Moody saw a man go into the room at approx. time of latter's murder he believed to be Tpr. Smith.

Character of Witness.

Lt. A. Platt - sworn, states.

I have known Cpl. Moody for 18 months. He is a good N.C.O., does a good job and on all his jobs, he has proved to be one of our best N.C.O.'s. I would certainly want him to continue as an N.C.O.

Plas for Mitigation.

First charge - pleaded guilty to being absent 12 hrs and 30 mins. His reason for not being in was not sufficient to condone the offence. He must have a hearing on his sentence. On 2 Oct - Saturday - met his wife in Harbours in afternoon Mrs. Moody was 6 mos. pregnant and under a doctor's care. By Saturday evening Mrs. Moody's condition had become such that Cpl. Moody was afraid to allow her to make the trip to his
