situation at the United Nations Assembly, had now recommended that the Canadian delegation be authorized to support in general terms a proposal to provide relief supplies to the amount of \$30 million for refugees from the war in Palestine.

If this were approved, the delegation would make no specific commitments regarding Canadian financial assistance and would resist any efforts to set up any compulsory scale of contributions; rather the intention would be to make the implementation of the resolution a matter for voluntary contributions.

It was also recommended that the Canadian government make available 600 tons of wheat flour to replace flour to be provided immediately by the governments of Egypt, Lebanon and Syria for relief of these refugees.

An explanatory note had been circulated.
