Add to the above that characteristic element of American life, the tendency to organization, and it will at once be seen that if a man's early training is good his natural interests, characteristics and God-given place in the world as a member of society all point to the part which he is to take in the actual constructive work laid down in the program of the Christian Church.

Our church life ought to be so planned as to utilize for the purpose of useful work in building up the kingdom of God every one of its members. Missions are the Christian Church at work in the world. Missions may for convenience be divided into local, state, home and foreign, which may be necessary geographical distinctions. The missionary enterprise furnishes, however, the field in which each mature Christian should find his particular place and work.
