THE ANNUAL MEETINGS OF 1877.

The Congregational Union of Ontario and Quebec met in Guelph, on Wednesday, June 6th, at 7.30 p.m., and continued in session until June 11th. The attendance was unusually large, and the arrangements all that could be desired. Forty-eight ministers and sixty-two delegates were present, besides a number of visitors.
