They suffered from hunger until the Red Cross took the work over. This organization reorganized everything so that every Canadian prisoner got three parcels a fortnight. Every two weeks a parcel of biscuits and cigarettes was received by each soldier, and every six months each soldier got a complete change of clothes.
