Famous Founder of the Order of Foresters Passes Away At Savannah.
Savannah, Ga., March 4.—Hon. Dr. Oronhyatekha of Toronto died at the

Oronhyatekha of Toronto died at the Desoto Hotel, in this city, at 5.20 o'clock Saturday afternoon.

His death was due to heart failure, from which, it was stated, he had been a sufferer for about ten years.

His body will be sent immediately to Toronto for burial, leaving here early to-day.

At the bedside of Dr. Oronhyatekha at the time of his death were his private secretary, W. W. Dunlop of Toronto, and A. E. Stevenson of Port Huron, Mich., assistant general manager of the Independent Order of For-

sters, of which Dr. Oronhystekha esters, of which Dr. Oronhyatekhas was supreme chief ranger.
Dr. Oronhyatekha's son, Dr. Ackland Oronhyatekha of Toronto, who had been notified of his father's critical condition, has started south from Toronto. He will probably meet the remains en route.
Dr. Oronhyatekha arrived in Savannah in the latter part' of January, coming in the hope that his health would be benefited. He seemed to rally at times, and recently gave out

would be benefited. He seemed to rally at times, and recently gave out an interview, in which he expressed the belief that the climate would prove beneficial.

Dr. Oronhyatekha is survived by his son and daughter, Mrs. Percy Johnson of Deseronto, and it is probable that his remains will be interred in that place by the side of those of his wife, who died several years age.

While in Savannah, Dr. Oronhyatekha received the very best medical attention. It was not until Thursday that his condition became serious. He was reported to be dying Friday, so that the end Saturday aftermoon was not unexpected.

CZAR TO BE SILENT.

Second Russian Parliament Won't Mear a Speech From the Throne:
St. Petersburg, March 4.—The Russiam Parliament, the second under the constitution decreed under Emperor Nicholas, Oct. 3, will assemble in the Tauride Palace to-morrow.
The Bouma will be called to order by one of the senior dignitaries of the empire, but there will be no speech from the throne.

Assassinated by Six Men.

Reval, Russia, March 4.—Baron Budberg, ex-chief of the Esthonian nobility and a member of the Council of the Empire, was set upon by six unknown men, while driving near his country seat, yesterday, and killed.

Of two servants accompanying the baron, one was killed and the other was wounded. The pockets of the dead men were rifled by their assaal-ants, who escaped.

SWEPT BY REFORMERS.

London County Council Elections Municipal Party Gain 43 Seats

London, March 4.—The returns at a London, March 4.—The returns at a late hour of the county council elec-tions, which exceeded in bitterness the parliamentary contest of 1905, indi-cate that the Municipal Reformers have gained 43 seats and the Pro-gressives and the Labor party one

have gained 43 seats and the Progressives and the Labor party one each.

The Socialistic or Labor party played an unprecedented part, fighting both the Progressives and the Municipal Reformers.

The Municipal Reformers have claimed that the defeat of the Progressives would be a serious blow to the Eiberal Government.

The outgoing council consisted of 35 Progressives, 34 Municipal Reformens and one independent.
