Avonport.

Mr. Wm. McVie, a returned missionary from Congo, supplied for the pastor at all the services last Sunday. In the morning at Lochartville he spoke on the customs and manners and lives of the Congoese. At Avonport in the Sunday-school he told of the lives of the boys and girls, and in the evening the subject was "Sleeping sickness." This subject, like all the other themes was dealt with in a masterly fashion: He traced this dread disease from its inception on to its final and fatal stages. It is needless to say that all the addresses were listened to with rapt attention and were much enjoyed by all.

On Tuesday evening Mr. McVie addressed the W. M. A. Society at their public meeting, the subject being "Women and woman's work in Congo." The speaker spoke of the requirements for this work: first a superabundance of health, and next, adequate preparation. He spoke of the fearful drain upon health and the high rate of mortality. Then followed some description of the life of the natives, of their home life, their burdens and their hopes. Pictures were presented of the sorrow of the women workers in that country, who, for their great love for their master, devote their lives to this dark land. The address, on the whole, was of a high order.

This public meeting of the Women's Aid seems to be one of the features of the place and was a great success. Two solos were also a part of the program, both of which were much enjoyed by those present. The singers were Miss Alma E. Huntly and Mrs. W. Wilson. After the program was over a lunch was served which also was much enjoyed.
