A by-law was voted on by the people, and then the city exceeded the powers granted it in the act, and the result was litiga-tion. The consensus of opinion among the city officials is that the Cataract will win out if it carries the case to the Privy Council, and that the city more than it could hope to save in the time of the contract. 
