

W. W. SHORT MAY RUN AS TORY CANDIDATE

TO CONTINUE AS TRADING CENTRE

EDMONTON WILL REMAIN DISTRIBUTING POINT FOR NORTH, SAYS BANKER.

(From Tuesday's Daily.) F. J. Francis, inspector of the Central Western branches of the Canadian Bank of Commerce, returned to Edmonton Saturday from a six-week trip to the Peace River country, during which time he completed arrangements for the opening of a branch of the Canadian Bank of Commerce, to serve the needs of the residents of Grande Prairie.

Beaver Lodge has been chosen as the location of the branch for the present. A temporary building is now being erected, and a formal announcement of the opening of the bank will be made in a few days.

Mr. Francis is accompanied on his trip through the Peace River country by C. Cady, one of the western managers of the bank. He was favorably impressed with the country.

The Grande Prairie is a beautiful country and the soil generally is of an excellent quality. This part of the Peace River district has received most of the settlement so far, but the district north of the Peace river, between the settlement and the Crossing and Drayton, is also being rapidly taken up.

A poor man would be unwise to go into Grande Prairie at the present time, as settlers need to have considerable capital, on account of the cost of living being so high. But a settler with capital enough to get along until he reaps his first crop should do well.

One homesteader at Beaver Lodge, W. H. Lowe, who has 80 acres in crop with oats, was offered \$1,000 for his crop as it stood on the field some time ago, but refused to sell.

The amount of actual trading done in the Peace River country is at present small, but it is the prevailing custom with the settlers to come out in the winter and buy their supplies at Edmonton.

Mr. Francis is of the opinion that Edmonton is likely to remain the principal trading centre and source of supply for the Peace River country, and that it will continue to be the gateway of the north, just as now, when Mr. A. Frederick built into it from both sides of the mountains.

FENDER ON THE CAR FAILED TO DO ITS WORK

This Is Believed To Have Been Cause of Little Child's Death by Being Run Over by Street Car—Inquest Being Held.

(From Tuesday's Daily.) The working of the fender in use on the Edmonton street cars was the subject to the fore in the inquest into the death of Denia Innocente Zelik, as the result of injuries received on Namayo avenue on Saturday afternoon from being run over by a street car which was being before Dr. Forin in the council chamber yesterday afternoon.

The evidence in the case was taken in charge by the car, Alex McCulloch, and the motorman, Alred Carlson, who were the chief witnesses, was taken, but aside from a searching inquiry into the working of the fender, the examination was largely an elaboration of the facts established in the morning papers of yesterday.

Mr. Carlson's account of the accident was that about 4:35 in the afternoon when proceeding down Namayo avenue he had just passed Short street when he saw two children on the sidewalk.

One was a girl of six years of age while the other was a tot of two or three. When about half way down the block, without a moment's warning the elder sprang out into the roadway and attempted to cross in front of the advancing car, followed at heels by the little one.

The conductor's evidence which took up the story at this point explained how the child was released from the precarious condition, where she was seemingly being choked to death by the weight of the motor on her abdomen. He decided that the most feasible course to release the child was to back the car off the prostrate body as there were no jacks at hand or other means of raising the car.

The passengers on board came to the assistance of the conductor and pushed it back. Questioned closely by the jurors both the men admitted that the fender had failed to work properly. The conductor thought that the child had slipped under entirely, but the motorman was of the opinion that the "trip" of the fender had done its work but that the position of the child had prevented the fender from altogether dropping and catching the child's body. At any rate the fender was found after the accident in its normal condition.

If at the conclusion of the evidence the jury was not satisfied the ill-fated child will be run on a spur and a demonstration made of the working of the fender in this particular car. Meanwhile the jury will continue the inquest tomorrow evening in the police court.

Timber Areas in Grande Prairie

Timber Cruisers Return From North—May Establish Mills.

(From Tuesday's Daily.) Prospects for the lumbering industry in Grande Prairie are declared good by J. W. Flanagan, of Chicago, and John Manning, of Moosevee, timber cruisers, who returned to Edmonton yesterday from six weeks' trip through the north country.

Mr. Flanagan is a member of the Vancouver lumber mill company, Flanagan & Hart, and as a result of his visit to the forests on the Smoky and Wapiti rivers, near the Grande Prairie, this company may establish a mill and branches in the Peace River district.

"There is a lot of good, standing timber along the Wapiti and Smoky rivers," said Mr. Flanagan, "but it is a pity that it is not being better protected. Forest fires have played havoc there in the last few years. We passed through burned areas, where millions of dollars worth of timber have been destroyed by fire in the last few years. Some of the best timber are of spruce trees that would cut a thousand feet of lumber. Some of the best should be taken into the government to protect the timber that remains."

The Peace River country is a whole is one of the finest countries I ever entered," said Mr. Flanagan. "Between Peace River Landing and Dunvegan I think it will be one of the finest wheat countries in the world. The Spruce River valley will be a splendid mixed farming district."

Mr. Flanagan reports the roads in Grande Prairie in good condition, with the exception of a twenty mile stretch in the Saddle Mountains, between Spirit River and Grande Prairie. He thinks the attention of the government should be drawn to the fact that sign posts are badly needed to indicate to travelers the direction in which divergent trails lead.

"There are cross roads where it is pure guess work to decide which way to turn, and one may not meet a once in a week. On the way from Peace River Landing to Dunvegan we went out of our way ten miles on a trail to Fort St. John before meeting some Indians, who informed us that we were heading in the wrong direction."

Messrs. Flanagan and Manning were present at the Grande Prairie sports celebration on July 3rd, 4th and 5th. They report crops in splendid condition throughout the north.

CHILD WAS KILLED BY A STREET CAR

Two-Year-Old Girl Was Struck by Fender of Car Near Corner of Namayo Ave. and Ross Street—Ambulance Collided with Dump Cart.

In attempting to cross Namayo avenue on Saturday afternoon about 5:30 o'clock a little two-year-old child, named Hilda Zelik, whose parents live at 2022 Namayo avenue, was struck by the fender of street car No. 18 in charge of Motorman A. Carlson, and rolled under the car, receiving such severe injuries that she passed away yesterday at the City Hospital.

The accident occurred a short distance north of Ross street, where it is supposed that the little child was playing with companions when struck with the car going north. Immediately after the accident Dr. Wilson was summoned and the public ambulance called from No. 3 fire hall to remove the child to the City Hospital. On examination here it was found that in addition to the breaking of several ribs, there were serious internal injuries. From the effects of these she died about half past four on Sunday morning.

In answering the emergency call the ambulance was proceeding up Namayo at a furious pace when it collided with a city dump cart which was standing along the curb. The driver instead of turning in to avoid the oncoming ambulance, turned out and the ambulance caught the hub and springing its axle and shaking the ambulance up badly. The damage did not prevent the ambulance proceeding to the accident and removing the victim.

It is not known whether the street railway motorman is to blame for the accident. It was impossible to get any information last night from the car barn and the whereabouts of the superintendent could not be ascertained in order to secure his version of the fatality.
