DIPHTHERIA.

Straits Complete Blank

The s.s. Diana arrived here at a.m. yesterday from the Straits of Belle Isle. She brought along 170 men and 14 women from Blanc Sablon, Greenly Island, Forteau and other fishing stations, including Lance au Loup. The fishery is a total failure all along the Straits, and out of 17 traps at Blanc Sablon and Greenly Island there are only 20 qtls. of fish ashore. Trawlers have an average of 25 qtls. per boat ashore. The total catch for Job Bros. 300 fisherment in the Straits is 2,000 gtls. The Diana landed men coming this way at Trinity, Hant's Harbor, Carbonear and other places. Penny's crew of 30 menn were landed at the latter places. Two hundred sail of schooners, which were fishing in the Straits, g have gone north to Labrador. These vessels have absolutely no fish, with the exception of four schooners, who have about 200 qtls. each. At Flower's Cove, Anchor Point and Ferrole, traps have from 2 to 3 qtls. It is the worst season in the Straits for a numer of years.


