Well Known

Man Drowned.

The storm of Saturday night raged with terrific violence at Port de Grave. A vessel that arrived there lately from Sydney was wrecked. A schooner belonging to Mr. Christopher was driven ashore and became a total wreck. A schooner that was at Bay Roberts from Grosbeak also went ashore and did a lot of damage to Mr. W. Bartlett's premises, her jibboom went through the building on the water front.

Was Horse Killed?

It is reported that as Mr. John Leese was driving out to church yesterday his horse was struck down by contact with an electric shock by contact with a live wire on Waterford bridge Road, where the line runs in the Lunatic Asylum, and that the horse perished from the effects of the shock. Mr. J. W. Morris, Superintendent of the electric department, on being interviewed said he had no report about it.

Perpetual Motion.

London, Nov. 14.—Perpetual motion is a recognized impossibility, but quality that nearly approaches it is claimed for the invention of a twenty-two-year-old Englishman. He has obtained a patent for a motor which, he asserts, will run as long as its iron and steel last. The young man's name is Stanley J. Hitechock and he lives in a London suburb.

"The Patent Office would not accept the title 'Perpetual Motion,'" he said, "and it is right, for perpetual action in its ordinary sense is impossible. My machine is therefore called a self-acting motor." There is no limit to its power and it will continue to run until it falls to pieces. Its principle is magnetism, and the secret of the discovery lies in the shape of the magnets, which makes them grow stronger the more they are used. The motor revolves in response to the same forces that make the world go round.

"From experiments made as a boy with penny magnets, milk cans, and tittings from incandescent gas jets, my father encouraged me and sent me as a pupil to Sir Hiram Maxim. There I worked in the laboratory."

"The machine can be fitted up in private houses and used to work a dynamo and so supply electric light, work the lift or sewing machine, do the cooking or pumping, or anything required of it at no cost at all."

"Its power is unlimited, and it could be built inside the ordinary motor omnibus bonnet. The only cost after installation is for lubrication."
