### Tenders for Supplying Note from Naples

Yesterday a letter was received from Mr. H. Le Messurier, of Naples, by the Beard of Trade. It was dated Nov. 21st and read as follows:-"Labrador. the market is overstocked, and most strongly advise you to cease all shipments at present. During the past few weeks the situation of Labrador fish has shown a steady decline, the cause of which is no doubt due to the large quantities of this commodity ar riving here, and also to allowances made on several cargoes, which made it possible for some of the buyers to sell at large reduction in prices a against their competitors. It is most advisable that further shipments b held back for the present, thus al lowing the market to recover."
