THE BRIG "WILLIAM," ONE OF OUR OLD TIME FLEET.

ne dismasting and loss of the rina," the finest sailing vessel of feet, puts me in mind of a notable rent in connection with John Munn Co.'s clipper, the "William", when was dismasted, under the comand of the late Captain Tizzard. He had just loaded an early cargo fish at Emily Harbor, Labrador, and to Genoa, Italy, and it was a e to market then just as it is now. th firm was determined to get the cargo across and secure top price The "William" was always looked n as one of the smartest vess mercantile marine, and fithou oubt Captain Tizzard was just the man to take all that was in her, out He never spared his vessel, his rew or himself in his effort to make nick passages, and those were the ays when there was rivalry between e captains, and the merchants backup their respective masters, giving hem everything they required as ng as they upheld the supremacy of

Their confidence in Captain Tizzard ras not misplaced and never was a frm served more faithfully, His loyalty to the old firm was without a doubt, and he looked after everything just as carefully as if the vessel and the property belonged to himself. The second night after leaving Em-Iv Harbor, the mainmast of the "William" was carried away. My old friend, Joe Burke, of Carbonear, was the bosun, and Albert Golder was

cabin-boy. Albert was the second son of Captain Golder, then ship's-hushand for John Munn & Co., but prevlously he was one of the officers on the "Great Eastern," when he distinguished himself in the laying of the first Atlantic cables from Valentia, Ireland, to Heart's Content, Newfoundland. In fact he was fourth officer. The mainmast of the "William" was carried away at midnight, and it was indeed a terrible state of affairs that met their view at daylight, to see such a splendid ship dismasted-rigging and sails torn away, her condition being almost a wreck. They were then in the latitude of Conception Bay, lut in those days there was never a hought of abandoning the ship, while hey had a place to stand on. I remember Joe Burke telling us how he miled when young Golder sang out, "Well, here is a nice mess for Harry Bosse (the ship carpenter of the firm) to fix up." But Captain Tizzard had no idea of trying to get to Harbor

Grace for repairs. There was a gale of wind blowing in the right direction, and he had his mind made up to reach market first as usual. That gale followed him. right across, and he reached Gibraltar in 14 days from Emily Harbor. It was a wonderful act of seamanship to take her across with one mast in such record time. He was two days in Gibpurchased the mainmast from a condemned brig, and rigged a jury-mast for the "William", and with all speed sailed for Genoa, Italy, which he reached six days later.

Capt. Tizzard wired the firm at Harbor Grace that it was his intention to make permanent repairs in Genoa, and he considered that the "William" would sail better with three masts than her former brig-rig of two masts which suggestion was accordingly acted upon by the firm. She was rigged as a barquetine, and she sailed most successfully for fully twenty-five years after when she was lost in the English Channel in December, 1906: I may here mention that after 1894, she was purchased by Messrs. Bowring Brothers of St. John's and was for some time commanded by that typical successful and experienced Newfoundland mariner, the late Capt. Patrick J. Howard of this city. She was afterwards sold to a firm in England. The "William" was built by Cox at Brixham, England, in 1872, and brought to this country by the famous Capt. Henry Bailey. My old frend, Capt. James Pike, at Carbonear, still hale and hearty, was in her for some time. There is a painting of the "William" in Munn & Co.'s Office to-day, showdeed a work of art, and is greatly admired by all who have the pleasure of viewing it.

As soon as possible I shall give the readers of the Telegram a brief sketch of the experience, danger and escape of Capt. Samuel Courtney and his crew of the barquentine "E. S. Hocken." "Few mariners in this country were better and more favorably known than Captain Courtney before he retired from seafaring life, and none made quicker passages than did the gallant and experienced mariner, and it will be rememberd that he ran the brigantine "Olinda" for several years almost on schedule time, and he has indeed been a most competent and fortunate commander. Like incinnatus of old our gallant friend retired to his farm some years ago, but it may be that some day, being t young man, he may once moe walk he quarter-deck of a larger, and let as hope, as fortunate a vessel as was imply proved while he was in com-mand of the "Olinda,"
