Last Evening's Blaze

**HORWOOD'S STOCK ROOMS OUT-
FIRE BY FIRE.**

The Central and West End Fire Companies responded to an alarm of fire at 7.20 last night, to the wharf premises of the Horwood Lumber Co., where one of the store houses was in a blaze. When the fire fighters arrived the second flat of the building was all in a blaze and to save the adjoining property from total destruction the pump was run out to the head of the wharf and in less than a minute two powerful streams of water taken from the harbor and directed on the burning building, while two additional streams were taken from the hydrants on Water Street. The firemen were working heroically together and with a splendid force of water at their disposal the flames were kept from spreading toward the adjoining shed. A quantity of lathes, shingles, etc., stored in the western end of the flat, continued to burn fiercely and before the firemen had a chance to get at the real seat of the blaze, the fire found its way into the upper flat and in a very few minutes the flames burst through the roof and sent up a huge black volume of smoke. Although the firemen were working under difficulties they concentrated their efforts and kept pouring tons of water into the western section of the flat, and after an hour's fight, the blaze was finally extinguished, but not before the building was rendered useless and the stock destroyed. Great praise is due the firemen for the heroic manner in which they worked, and had it not been for their persistent efforts, greater destruction might have followed. The premises was owned by Mr. James McLaughlin, and was used by the Horwood Lumber Co. for storing their stock. How the fire originated is not known.

Laid to Rest

The funeral of the late Miss Gertrude Isabella Parsons took place from her residence, Forest Road, yesterday afternoon, and was attended by a large concourse of citizens. Following the brief but simple service at the residence, the sad cortege, before proceeding to the General Protestant Cemetery, wended its way to Gower Street Methodist Church, where a special service was held. The casket, covered with beautiful floral offerings, was tenderly carried into the church, and as the procession moved down the aisle to the Rostrom, the choir sang with full solemnity "When Our Heads Are Bowed With Woe."

The service was conducted by the Revs. Hammond Johnson, C. H. Johnson, Dr. Fenwick and Dr. Darby. A portion of the church was occupied by delegates to the W.M.S. Convention, of which the deceased was Secretary. The memorial address was delivered by Rev. Hammond Johnson, in which he made touching reference to the memory of the departed. Following the singing of the hymn "Peace, Perfect Peace," the congregation stood with bowed heads whilst the Dead March in Saul was played.

The cortege then left the church and wended its way to the General Protestant Cemetery, where the mortal remains were reverently laid to rest.

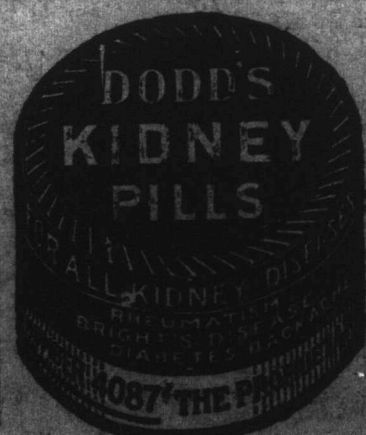
The service at the graveside was conducted by Rev. Hammond Johnson, assisted by Rev. Dr. Darby.

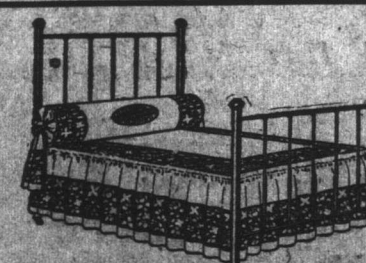

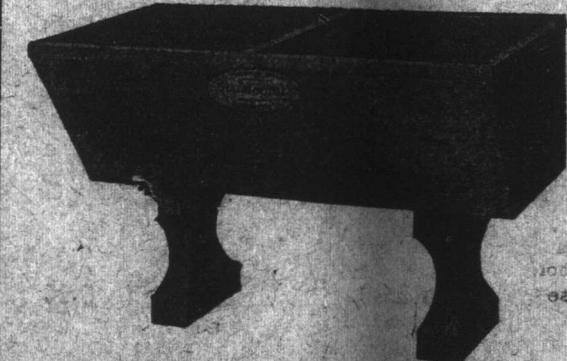
